ABOUT CENTRO

Centro Hispano of Dane County was founded in 1983 by community volunteers, including Ilda C. Thomas, who also served as the agency's first Executive Director, to meet the emergent needs of Cuban refugees recently settled in Madison.

As the Latinx community throughout Dane County grew and diversified over the years, so did Centro's programs and services. Centro is located at 810 West Badger Road in the heart of Madison's south side. The agency now serves over 2,500 families and over 7,000 individuals through its yearly programs and services.

EMPOWERING YOUTH: Through our youth programs—Juventud (middle school program), Escalera (high school program), [Re]Generación (high school program), Avanzando Through College (college program)—Centro focuses on taking a holistic approach in providing bilingual services such as: resources, connections, interactive engagement, guest speakers, culture, identity. Centro builds a sense of community through internship and scholarship opportunities to all our students for a brighter future.

STRENGTHENING FAMILIES: At Centro, we offer services to provide our families with the primary support and resources they need to address common difficulties with fraud, unemployment, legal issues, health care and much more. Centro also has case managers who provide specialized assistance with immigration and criminal justice cases. Each case manager works with hundreds of clients each year.

ENGAGING THE COMMUNITY: Throughout the year, Centro provides a consistent space for Latinx community and their allies to gather. Our 18,000-square-foot facility, two parking lots, and community gardens offer plenty of unique spaces to simultaneously accommodate various activities and events.

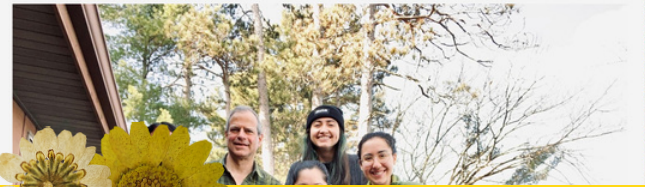

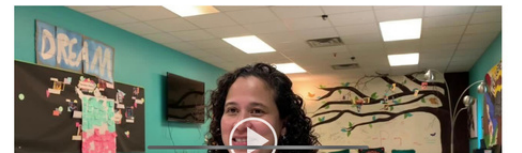

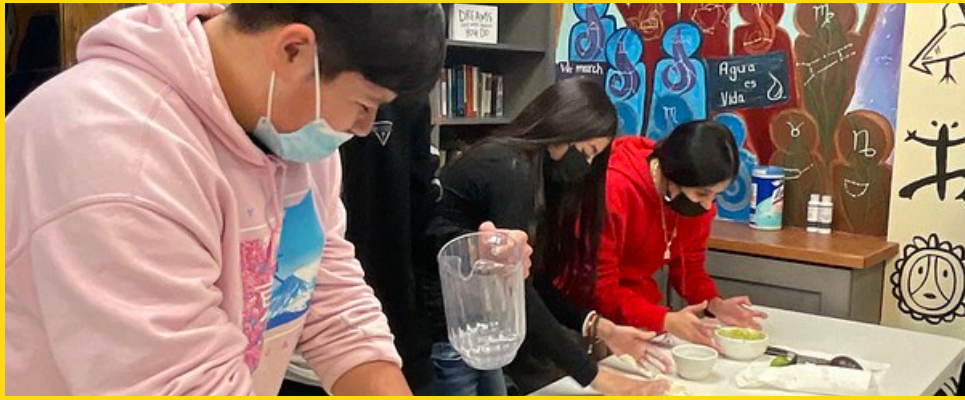

MOMENTS AT CENTRO 2022



EMPOWERING YOUTH

Our programs revolve around a holistic approach to student success, incorporating mentoring, academic tutoring, hands-on workshops, team building, community involvement, field trips, and guest speakers into our curriculum. By fostering a sense of belonging and encouraging active community participation, we aim to create a supportive environment for youth to thrive.

The Juventud Program, is offered at five area middle schools to 120+ students, and its mission is to re-engage “disengaged” Latinx youth so they are prepared to succeed by making a safe transition from middle to high school and beyond.

In 2022, our Juventuras youth benefitted from two new partnerships with the Lussier Family Heritage Center and the Wisconsin Bike Federation. Students could swim, bike, canoe, fish, forage for berries, and learn about native Wisconsin plants and animals!

In fall 2022, we added two new schools to our youth programming: Vel Phillips Memorial High School and Thomas Jefferson Middle School. At Jefferson, our Juventud programming takes place during the school day as an elective course.





PROGRAMS THAT EMPOWER YOUTH

Juventuras is Centro's summer youth program for middle school students, offering fun and adventures in community.

The Escalera Program uses a national evidence-based curriculum developed by UnidosUS model to provide academic support 100 Latinx students in grades 9-12. The goal is to promote upward economic mobility for Latinx students through programming that focuses on increasing academic achievement, career planning, and exposure to advanced careers.

Escalera Summer Internship Program is a supervised experience in which the youth are placed in a work environment to shadow professionals and to learn and practice job skills. The duration of this experience is a minimum of 45 hours, including the Escalera college preparation and career awareness sessions. Work performance is monitored and evaluated by business professionals and Escalera staff.



BECAS PROGRAM

Through the **Becas (Scholarships) Program**, Centro offers annual scholarships to students who have been involved with the agency or enrolled in one of Centro's youth programs to help further their educational goals and help cover the cost of higher education.

HEALTH CARE NAVIGATORS

Centro has bilingual Spanish and English health care navigators. Their primary purpose is to assist individuals/families in their search for health coverage options within the Marketplace and Badger Care (Medicaid). The navigators provide information and may also offer insights into supplementary resources and programs such as Health Connect that could prove valuable for individuals, in addition to ACA options. The navigators evaluate eligibility for coverage and offer assistance in completing enrollment forms online and by phone.

WORKFORCE & CAREER PATHWAYS

Caminos (Pathways) Career Programs have proven to be effective in diversifying employment sectors and increasing retention rates of Latinx professionals in health, finance, government, admin, and tech jobs. By focusing on community members' assets and strengths, Caminos provides holistic training and coaching that build lifelong knowledge and transferable skills to promote family sustaining wages and career advancement. Caminos employer partners are committed to working with Centro and build more equitable career pipelines.

Caminos Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) prepares the next generation of multicultural CNA's and future nurses through a 5-month program in partnership with Madison College, hospitals, hospices and senior living partners.

Caminos Finance has forged partnerships with five prominent area credit unions, banks and Madison College to develop a successful career pathway into the Finance sector. After 9 weeks of training and a 3-credit class on personal finances, graduates are hired as bilingual tellers, bilingual universal bankers, bilingual customer service representatives among other positions.

WORKFORCE & CAREER PATHWAYS



Caminos Progreso is a versatile training, it pivots based on local and national sector needs. These sectors have included, manufacturing, biotech and customer service. Looking into the future, Progreso will partner with Dane County and its Dane County Public Safety Communications Department to prepare bilingual 911 dispatchers and communicators. In addition to developing professional and job readiness skills, participants will obtain the Emergency Telecommunicator certificate.

General Employment services assist Spanish-speaking community members in navigating U.S. workforce systems, applying for jobs, building confidence, and creating a resume and cover letter.

Latinas in Savings (LIS) provides bilingual (Spanish/English) and culturally competent financial education workshops with personal support to motivate participants to join a savings challenge, create short-term and long-term goals to build wealth and plan for retirement.

This partnership aims to support the Latinx community well-being through mental health and wellness programming and structural change (see: <https://esperanza.wisc.edu/>).

During 2022 we have positioned Esperanza to continue cultural and linguistically appropriate training and services (CLAS) that support healing ethno and racial trauma (HEART) and radical healing for the Latinx community.

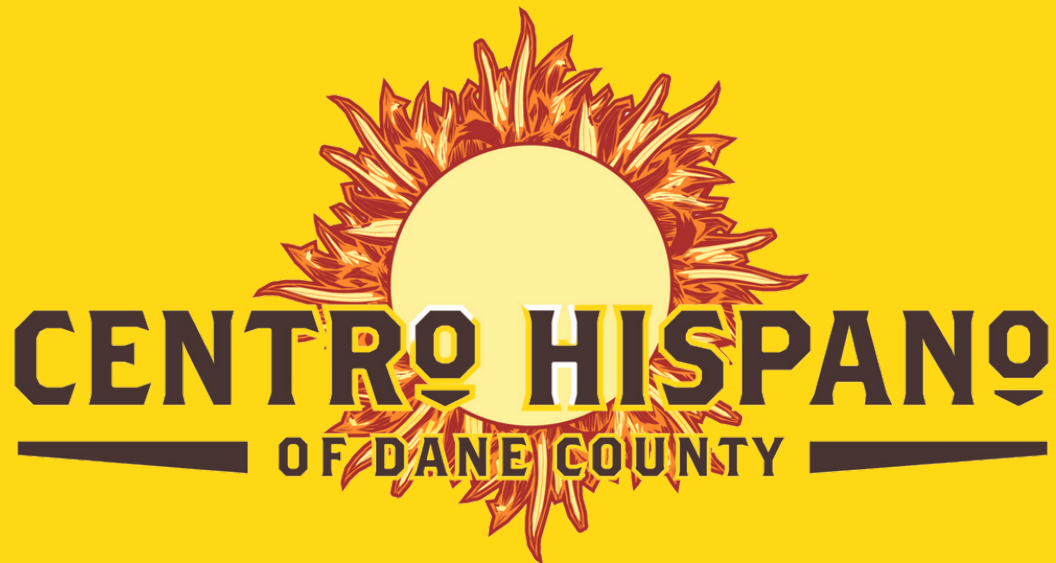
